Introduction to WAMAP (Washington Mathematics Assessment and Placement)

Monday, April 20th at Inglemoor High School, 2:30 – 4:00

OR Monday, May 4th at Bothell High School, 2:30 – 4:00

WAMAP is a web based mathematics assessment and course management platform that is provided free to Washington State public educational institution students and instructors. This system is designed for mathematics, providing delivery of homework, quizzes, tests, practice tests, and diagnostics with rich mathematical content. Students can receive immediate feedback on algorithmically generated questions with numerical or algebraic expression answers.

Join Steve Yramategui, Math Faculty at Cascadia, for an introduction to WAMAP and ideas on how to use online assessments to supplement your classes. Prior to the workshop, participants need to get an instructor account by requesting it through wamap.org at least three days in advance.

Getting to Know the COMPASS Math Placement Test

The COMPASS test is used by many community colleges in Washington state, including Cascadia, for mathematics placement of entering students. Join Northshore School District teachers and Cascadia math faculty in taking the COMPASS test on a computer the same way that students experience it.
